

MATRICS OF 2020:

An impressive academic achievement during a disruptive school year

We are so proud of our Matric Class of 2020, who responded incredibly well to a vastly different learning environment. We salute our boys for their collective and individual achievements: they have once again remained true to our motto of Incepto Ne Desistam, and produced a great set of results.

Shaheen Govender, our Dux for 2020, truly excelled by placing 2nd in the province, alongside Proxime Accessit Hemal Harkhu, who placed 5th, and Kiarin Naidoo who took 7th place.

The 219 Westville Boys' High School 2020 candidates achieved a remarkable set of results, with 433 subject distinctions, a 96% pass rate and 93,6% of our boys obtaining a Bachelor or Diploma pass.

9 boys achieved 8 or more distinctions, 20 boys achieved 7 distinctions or more, and 25 boys achieved 6 distinctions or more. 55 of our boys achieved 3 or more distinctions and 88 of our boys achieved a 70% aggregate or higher.

MAINTAINING A SAFE & COMPETITIVE SPORTS SCENE




Congratulations to Luca Holtzhausen and Guy Brooks who toppled the 7 standing records together. Chad le Clos' records have stood since 2009 and 2010.



BOARDING HOUSE REVAMP

6 Huberta Road Boarding House, owned by the WBHS Foundation, is currently undergoing a R3m remodelling, entirely funded by Old Boys and companies with a vested interest in the school. This will effectively add 20 more beds to the house, giving it a capacity of 28 with room for 3 boarder masters. The project is expected to be completed in June 2021.


NEW STAIRWAYS

MEDIA CENTRE REMODELLING

After months of planning, careful preparation and implementation, the WBHS Media Centre has been transformed into a fresh, contemporary, highly-functional and innovative space.

The Media Centre Manager, Lynne Worth, recognised the need for a new, modern approach when she took over last year.



"The WBHS Media Centre renovation project began in the middle the COVID pandemic," said Lynne. "The shutdown of the Media Centre during this time was most unfortunate but necessary, and this gave us an opportunity to start planning a very long overdue Media Centre upgrade."

"My vision was for a multi-functional, flexible space. The Centre needed to be an area where the boys can work, research and read in a comfortable, quiet and clean environment." She added, "The space created has also allowed for new and exciting projects, which will include drone flying and building and coding robotics. These will be introduced in the next few months."

COMMONS FIELD CRICKET NETS & DRAINAGE

The Commons Field cricket nets have undergone a makeover, with a new synthetic surface and fresh

netting. Water drainage on Commons Field has also been addressed, with a new retaining wall to enable better runoff.


MULTI-SPORT COURT
